Kings Leaze Senior's Report

Our novice show jumping team for the area qualifier on the 2nd November 14 competed at Summer House in Gloucestershire. The team were Lynn Barrett and Jolly Ollie, Fran Dark and Matcho, Chesley Evans and Perrots Hill and the fourth member was Sue Ravenhill-Handley and Stirling Silver Hill. The team were 11th overall with Fran achieving a double clear over the two rounds and coming 4th individually. Thank you to everyone for coming along and supporting the club.



On the team front it has been quiet over the winter months but now its full steam ahead with the new years competitions. I have taken over as senior manager for all teams now so please contact me either through Face book or the form on our website or via email <u>klrc_sarah@sky.com</u> if you would like to be on a team or just to know more information about up coming events.

Due to popular demand, BRC have introduced a new Championship for 2015. The Intermediate Winter Championships will take place on 2 and 3 May 2015 and qualifiers will start from 1 October 2014. This new Winter Championship will be held at Bury Farm Equestrian Village, Slapton, Bucks LU7 9BT.

With classes for both seniors and juniors, including dressage for teams and individuals, with one prelim, two novice and one elementary test and Intermediate show jumping teams, round one starting at 95cm.

The new Intermediate show jumping qualifier will be held on Saturday 14th March 15 at Summerhouse currently there is no schedule but it will be for teams of four.

The first round will be 95cm and it states to be built to BS standards with fillers etc. Horses must not have more than 20 BE points or £225 BS notional winnings, ponies must not have won 20 BE point and £500 BS notional winnings.

The new Intermediate dressage qualifier competition is to be held at Leyland Court on Sunday 1st March 2015. This is a Team Competition for Senior and Junior teams, with 4 riders each riding a different test – Prelim 13 (2006) Novice 28 (2008) Novice 34 (2009) Elementary 42 (2008).

There will be an area qualifier for The Festival of the Horse and this will be an Eventers challenge to be held at Wickstead Horseplay, Highworth on Sunday 12th April 2015. This competition is designed to be a test of a horse and rider's ability to negotiate a show jumping course together with a cross-country course. The Challenge consists of seven to ten show jumps followed by fifteen to twenty-five cross-country efforts, which may include up to three dressing fences in the Junior and Senior Pairs Championships (optional at Area Qualifiers). Qualifiers will be run at Club and Area level to give members the maximum possible chance to qualify.

There are six challenge classes:

- Senior 100
- Junior 100
- Senior 90
- Junior 90
- Senior Pairs 90
- Junior Pairs 90



We are holding training rallies for simulated XC and show jumping and the first one will be at Mendip Plains Equestrian Centre on Saturday 17th January 2015. This seems to have been a very popular rally so we will try and repeat it in the next couple of months.

Pony Club and Riding Club Eventer Challenge sponsored by Dodson & Horrell held at Blenheim Palace Horse Trials and although the competition is not to Thursday 17th September 2015 we have to put entries in by 2nd March 15. These very popular events are grass-arena-based competitions, held in the Bladon Arena, over a testing course of 1.05m show jumps and cross country jumps with an optimum time for completion. For teams from Riding Clubs or Pony Clubs the team with the lowest cumulative score are the winners, but there is also an award for the most stylish rider.

This is a great opportunity to ride at The Blenheim Horse Trials this is quite a stiff competition so you need to be capable of competing at BE100 level. Teams consist of four and can include one junior member. So if you would like to go to this competition let me know.

Please keep checking our website or Facebook pages to keep up to the minute on what rallies and instruction is available. I will also keep sending emails out with our news, if you haven't had anything from me and would like to receive the latest news please send me an email and then I will know I have the correct address for you.

As stated above I'm now organising all senior teams and I'm always looking for members to have ago so if you haven't been on a team before maybe 2015 is your year!!
